INSTITUTIONAL DISTINCTIVENESS

“Helping hand to uplift the drought-affected mass sections of the society by providing Financial Support”

Introduction:

The institution is the oldest HEI in the vicinity established in the year 1963 by renowned Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, an educational society founded by the visionary Padmabhusan Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil, to cater to the needs of downtrodden people with the motto “Education through self-help is our motto”. One of the maxims of the parent institution is upliftment of masses. The institution has the vision to provide quality higher education for the downtrodden mass sections of the society.

Distinct to our Vision to provide quality higher education for the downtrodden mass sections of the society, Balwant College provides financial assistance to the needy and deserving students through Student Aid Fund (SAF), Instalment facility, special support to sports students and various government as well as non-government scholarships. The HEI takes utmost care that not a single student must be dropped out only because of financial constrictions.

Objectives:

- To provide education to the drought-affected section of the society by providing financial assistance.
- To impart education to the society's poor and financially weaker section.
- To decrease the dropout rate by financially supporting deserving needy students.
- To avail of government and non-government scholarships

The college is situated in a drought-prone area and most of the admitted students to the institute are from economically weaker backgrounds and are first-generation learners. Due to the weak financial conditions, many worthy students seem to be on the verge of leaving their education. Some so many students are academically bright, have superior sports skills, and got remarkable extra-curricular potential. However, due to financial constraints, they may find it difficult to pursue their higher education and explore new opportunities to

become successful in career. Keeping in mind all these conditions, the college provides all the government as well as non-government scholarships and other various means of financial assistance to economically weaker students. The students are also encouraged to avail 'Earn and Learn' scheme to continue their higher education. The result of these efforts is very fruitful and due to such initiatives the dropout rate of students seems to be declined.

Scholarship Schemes:

1. Government Scholarships and Freeships:

These are given under Social Justice and Special Assistance Department by Central Govt. to SC, ST, NT, OBC etc. students. Purpose is to provide financial assistance for education, to reduce drop out ratio, to create passion for higher education, to bring in mainstream of education.

2. Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj Shikshan Shulkh Shishyavrutti:

Under Directorate of Higher Education, scholarship is applicable to economically weaker sections. Family income of students should be below Rs. 8 lakh. Student admitted under General Category is eligible for this. Applicant should be resident of Maharashtra.

3. Students Aid Fund (SAF):

This is scheme of college to grant financial assistance to poor students. Committee is constituted which invites applications from needy students. Students should produce income certificate of parents to Committee. On basis of financial background, regular attendance and academic progress, Committee recommends to these students.

4. Institutional Scholarships:

Its motive is to encourage students to learn and to achieve higher rank in University examinations. Fund for scholarship is raised by faculties and stakeholders. Collected amount is deposited in bank. Then interest amount received by college is distributed amongst meritorious students.

5. Central Sector Scholarships:

Objective of scheme is to provide financial assistance to meritorious students having family income of less than Rs.6 lakh per annum. Students who are above 80 percentiles of successful candidates in class XII and pursuing regular course and not availing benefit of any or scholarships, are eligible to apply under this Scheme. Rate of scholarship is Rs. 10,000/- per annum for first three years and Rs. 20,000/- per annum for fourth and fifth year. This is covered under Direct Benefit Transfer.

Evidence of Success:

Students are able to continue their education with the financial support by various schemes of government as well as non-government agencies. They have recorded a good success rate every year. With the help of these financial supports to the students, the institute has been successfully achieving its vision and mission, i.e., upliftment of masses. Outcomes:


- It helped to increase students to enroll for Higher Education.
